

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN
ANTHROPOLOGICAL SURVEY OF INDIA,
MINISTRY OF CULTURE, GOVERNMENT OF INDIA
NORTH EAST REGIONAL CENTRE, SHILLONG
AND
RAMAKRISHNA MISSION ASHRAMA (RKM), CHERRAPUNJEE

Preamble:

The ANTHROPOLOGICAL SURVEY OF INDIA (An.S.I.) is a subordinate office under the Ministry of Culture, Government of India. AnSI is a premier specialized centre for advanced scientific research in Anthropology since 1945. The Anthropological Survey of India has been rendering significant service to the world of knowledge through its contribution on the People of India in respect of their social-cultural, biological heritage. With the mandate of documenting and disseminating our rich cultural heritage, the Survey has several Zonal Anthropological Museums in the country, to narrate the story of Man in all its perspective, as also to salvage and preserve the fast-vanishing aspects of tangible heritage viz material culture, art and crafts of the country. These museums act as a major centre of research not only in technology and material culture but also in integrated studies of Man in relation to his environment. With a broader objective to provide the common masses particularly the children and the youth, a proper perspective to overgrow sectarian and regional prejudices and to look upon entire humanity as a unity.

Whereas the RAMAKRISHNA MISSION ASHRAMA (RKM), Cherrapunjee, as a centre of RAMAKRISHNA MISSION established in 1931 to look into the educational needs of the locals in Cherrapunjee and its adjoining areas. During this long journey of over 85 years, RKM strives to provide various types of Tribal Welfare Services in the fields of education, health care and social upliftment in this region. Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama is also running a Tribal Cultural Museum at Cherrapunjee which also attracts a huge number of visitors everyday from various parts of country, thus disseminating the tribal and folk culture of the region.

In recognition of the broad objectives of both the organizations, the Anthropological Survey of India in collaboration with Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama (RKM), Cherrapunjee hereby agree to sign this Memorandum of Understanding for the regeneration of the existing Anthropological Gallery by this Survey attached to the Tribal Cultural Museum at Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama (RKM), Cherrapunjee complex on this day of..... 2024, on the following understanding:

1. This Memorandum of Understanding is made and entered into by and between the ANTHROPOLOGICAL SURVEY OF INDIA, NORTH EAST REGIONAL CENTRE, SHILLONG, whose address is Mawblei, Block-B, Madanrting, Shillong, Meghalaya, PIN-793021 and the RAMAKRISHNA MISSION ASHRAMA,

CHERRAPUNJEE (Sohra), whose address is At- Cherrapunjee, P.O.- Cherrabazar. Dist.- East Khasi Hills, Meghalaya, PIN-793111.

2. A MOU between the two organizations viz. AnSI and RKM was signed on 27.06.2008 (Annexure-1). The MOU was valid for a period of 3 (three) years i.e. from 27.06.2008 to 27.06.2011.
3. The Anthropological Survey of India (An.S.I.) had as per MOU dated 27.06.2008 opened an additional gallery alongwith with its artifacts attached to the Tribal Cultural Museum within the Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama (RKM), Cherrapunjee complex. The gallery had an area measuring 72.82 square meter floor area and 54.86 square meter wall area which is earmarked for the Anthropological Gallery of Anthropological Survey of India.
4. This new MOU is effective from the day and date last signed and executed by the duly authorized representatives of the parties. The MOU will remain valid for a period of 05 (Five) years. This MOU should preferably not be terminated before this time frame, and it can be renewed with the consent of both the parties.
5. The Anthropological Survey of India, North East Regional Centre, Shillong will be organizing thematic displays that would be periodically changed time to time under intimation to the Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama (RKM), Cherrapunjee.
6. Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama (RKM), Cherrapunjee will keep the gallery open to daily (Closed on Monday and enlisted national holidays) for the visitors. Every Monday the maintenance work will be done by the Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama (RKM), Cherrapunjee.
7. AnSI will engage one contingency staff (one attendant) through an outsourced manpower agency (as per rule) for the upkeep of the Anthropological Gallery at RKM. The payment of wages of the contingency staff (one attendant) will be borne by AnSI, NERC, Shillong
8. Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama (RKM), Cherrapunjee will maintain the gallery and bear expenses of electric charges, water charges, cleaning charges, etc.
9. Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama (RKM), Cherrapunjee will provide the basic civic amenities to the visitors like clean toilet, safe drinking water, proper sitting arrangements, etc.
10. Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama (RKM), Cherrapunjee may keep the gallery partially or temporarily closed as and when required for maintenance/repair or renovation of the building with the prior intimation to the Anthropological Survey of India, North East Regional Centre, Shillong.

11. Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama (RKM), Cherrapunjee will keep the safety and security of the exhibits and artifacts which is displayed by the Anthropological Survey of India but will not remain responsible for any natural calamities or reason beyond control.
12. The gallery thus put up will display a sign board acknowledging the Anthropological Survey of India, North East Regional Centre, Shillong. The sign board will be designed and displayed by the Anthropological Survey of India at the premises of the gallery and the surrounding areas of Cherrapunjee. In this connection logistic support and cooperation will be provided by the Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama (RKM), Cherrapunjee.
13. The Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama (RKM) may introduce a ticketing system to augment the enhancement of galleries. With respect to the proposed introduction of the ticketing system, Anthropological Survey of India registers no objections. However, the Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama (RKM) shall introduce the ticketing system with due intimation to Anthropological Survey of India, and also periodic information about the earnings.
14. The nominal repairing work inside of the existing Anthropological Gallery area, electrification, engagement worker/technician/electrician/carpenter etc., conservation and preservation items and display materials will be provided by the AnSI and expenditure in this regard to be borne by the Anthropological Survey of India.
15. Gallery design, display technique, presentation and preservation of the object will be done by the Anthropological Survey of India.
16. In the event of any disputes or differences arising out of, or in connection with, this Memorandum of Understanding, the matter should be settled mutually by the Anthropological Survey of India and Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama. In this regard, the Ministry of Culture would act as an arbitrator.
17. All the above conditions can be jointly reviewed by Anthropological Survey of India and Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama from time to time.
18. This Memorandum of Understanding shall be executed in two originals on non-judicial stamp paper of appropriate value. Each party shall retain one original each of the Memorandum of Understanding.
